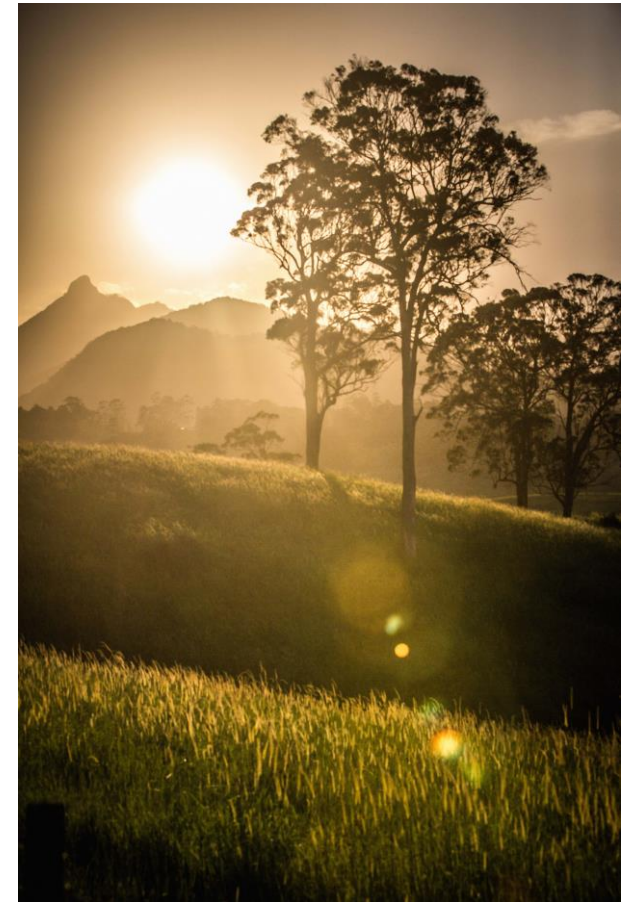

Nestled in the world's second largest volcanic caldera, the Tweed Valley offers the perfect destination for driving escapes. Whether you're looking for a day out in the country or a couple of relaxing days away, you'll find our suggested touring routes include plenty of interesting stops and some wonderful people to meet along the way.



MURWILLUMBAH

Start your touring at the **World Heritage Rainforest Centre and Visitor Information Centre** in Murwillumbah. The diorama here provides a great visual overview of the stunning volcanic landscape you'll be driving through and local volunteers can help with maps and information on the region's unique flora and fauna.

CRYSTAL CREEK

At **Crystal Creek Miniatures**, Carolyn and John Tebbutt have a fascinating history with animals. They breed miniature horses, zebu cattle, mules and donkeys, and you can meet them all on a walking tour at 10.30am. The only large animal among all these Liliputians is Palmdale Mishka – a real character and the subject of a popular children's book written by Carolyn.

CHILLINGHAM

At **Chillingham Bush Tucker**, farmer Buck Buchanan grows some of the Valley's most exotic fruits including the Tweed's own native fingerlimes with a bubbly pulp like lime-flavoured caviar, which Buck supplies to some of Australia's top restaurants, including Tetsuya's in Sydney. He also grows Buddha's hands fruits, Japanese yuzu fruit, kaffir limes, local Davidson plums, fragrant lemon myrtle and more. See them all growing in the showcase garden out behind the rustic store and stock up on



locally made gourmet goodies and Buck's own range of skincare products.

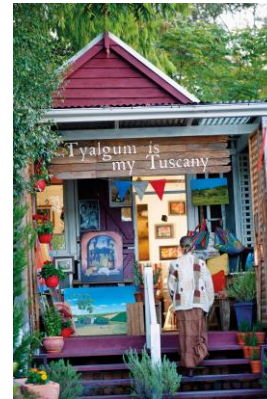
LIMPINWOOD

Along the road through Limpinwood, enjoy stunning views of the western wall of this ancient volcanic caldera formed by the towering cliffs of the Border Ranges.

TYALGUM

Once a logging village, Tyalgum is steeped in old world charm, with many of the historic shopfronts now restored to their former glory.

- Visit **Flutterbies Cottage Café** for delicious lunches or one of their signature Flutterbie Cakes;
- Sample a range of fresh-roasted blends in a 'coffee cupping' at **Flutterbucks**;
- Buy local organic skincare and cleaning products at **The Thin Green Line**;
- Frock up in local designs - recently showcased at Australian Fashion Week - at **House of Canelli**;
- Select artworks and jewellery at **Tyalgum is my Tuscany**;
- Browse giftware and clothing at **Paddingtons** and **The Little Shop Next Door**; and
- Stock up on craft supplies at **Kenitas Decorative Arts**.



History lovers will also want to visit the 100+-year-old **Tyalgum General Store** and the acoustically-perfect **Tyalgum Village Hall** which attracts some of Australia's leading musicians to the **Tyalgum Mucis Festival**, held over the first weekend in September each year.

MT WARNING

As the remnant plug of the ancient Tweed volcano, the towering peak (1157m) of Mt Warning is visible from every corner of the Valley and way out to sea. Named by Captain James Cook in 1770, it is a site of great spiritual significance to the local



Aboriginal people and is believed to mark a convergence of the earth's energy lines (ley lines). Experience the special magic of this sacred place and its World Heritage listed rainforests on the 200m Lyrebird Track or challenge yourself to the 8km (round trip) hike to the summit. You should allow four hours for the summit track and walkers are advised not to depart after 12 noon.
